### **Important information**

- Summer allowances are 117,612 cubic feet per acre.
- ❖ Mailing address changes are the responsibility of the property owner. Delinquent fees due to an inaccurate mailing address <u>will not be waived</u>. (See Resolution No. 2016-5).
- Credit/Debit cards are accepted on our WEBSITE ONLY We are not equipped to take payments over the phone.
- Checks or cash are accepted in the office.
- \* Residential customers with irrigation systems are required by state law to have a backflow device which must be tested annually. Proof of testing must be provided to our office.
- ❖ Landowners are required to turn on/off their own separate irrigation meters if smaller than 3".

### DOMESTIC METER READING AND IRRIGATION SEASON

The District will begin reading meters **April 4<sup>th</sup>**. If you have a large manual read meter, please remove any insulation from your meter box and clear away bushes, shrubs, etc. prior to the 4th. Residents in developed neighborhoods need not remove insulation as meters are read by radio. You should still check the meter box for any damage and ensure the insulation is serving its purpose.

Additionally, the District will do a midsummer reading on separate irrigation meters. If you want to know how much water, you have used after July you can call the office for the reading.

Simple Tips to help curb water waste:

- 1. Water your lawn in the early morning or late evening minimizes evaporation.
- 2. Use an automatic timer on your sprinkler or set a kitchen timer to remind you to turn off the water.
- 3. Inspect irrigation systems and fix leaks and broken or clogged sprinkler heads. Make sure you're watering the yard and not the street and roadways.
- 4. Skip a day lawns only need watered every 3 to 5 days in the summer.
- 5. Leaving your grass long encourages grass roots to grow deeper and grass blades to hold more moisture.

#### CONSUMER CONFIDENCE REPORT

As required by the Washington State Department of Health, a report on your water quality is included. The District routinely samples for microbial contaminants such as coliform bacteria, E-Coli and fecal coliform. The District also samples for lead and copper, inorganic chemicals and volatile organics every three years.

Presently the District chlorinates the system south of the Spokane River. We continually monitor our system for all sources of contaminants and want to assure you the quality of our water is safe. We are committed to providing outstanding service to our customers. Please do your share and install proper backflow devices correctly when installing an irrigation system. You may also notify the office if you notice any suspicious activity or have any water concerns.

## WATER USE EFFICIENCY GOALS

The District will offer rebates annually for water efficient toilets (1 toilet per house up to 20 homes per year at \$50 a toilet), sprinkler rain sensors (1 rain sensor per house up to 20 homes per year at \$25 a sensor), and hose bib timers (2 hose bib timers per house up to 50 homes per year up to \$20). These rebates are on a first come first served basis and proof of purchase will be required.

## **SNOWBIRDS**

The fee to turn off/on water meters due to vacancy in the winter is \$33.22 (including tax and overhead) per season. 10-day notice of departure and arrival dates is required. Meters will not be turned back on without the presence of the occupant of the house.
